

SAANZ Exceptional Service Award

The Exceptional Service award will be presented to a sociologist who is considered by the Executive to have provided an outstanding contribution to the advancement of sociology in Aotearoa New Zealand. Such contribution may include:

- A significant body of scholarship;
- Leadership or peer support of the sociology community;
- Exceptional teaching, pastoral care and/or student-support;
- Contributions to public analysis and debate; and/or
- Working with communities to enhance the wellbeing of Aotearoa

The winner of the award will be announced during the annual SAANZ Conference. There is an expectation, but not a requirement, that the nominee will be present to receive the reward. The prize for the winner of the award is a citation from SAANZ.

Criteria

 The sole criteria for the Award shall be that, in the opinion of the SAANZ Executive Committee, the nature of the contribution being recognised demonstrates outstanding service to the discipline

Eligibility

 The award is open to any sociologist who has made a significant contribution to New Zealand sociology

Nomination Procedure

- A call for nominations will be made in any year the prize is to be awarded
- The call for nominations and the closing date will be posted on the SAANZ website and distributed via the fortnightly e-newsletter
- Nominations can be made by any individual, organisation, or department
- A nomination form must be completed along with a statement of not more than one A4 page, outlining the candidate's contribution to sociology. This should be emailed to online@saanz.net
- Decisions will be made be made by the SAANZ Executive in the Spring of any year and awarded that same year at the SAANZ Annual General Meeting
- Up to one award can be given in any year. The Executive Committee can decide not to award a prize in any given year
